Guidelines for citing materials from the Wesley Works Editorial Project website

In all cases:

Mention on your first citation, or in an appropriate list of acknowledgments for a volume, that you accessed the material at the website of The Wesley Works Editorial Project. (web-links will remain stable and may also be included)

For Research Resources, like the biographical guide and sermon register:

Give the title and (if given) the author/compiler of the resource as listed on website.

For Transcriptions of Published Texts:

Cite original publication details — but note using transcription from WWEP site.

Examples:

Rev. Samuel Wesley Jr. to John Wesley, June 15, 1731, Arminian Magazine 1 (1778), 129; as transcribed on wesley-works.org/john-wesleys-in-correspondence.
Susannah Designe to John Wesley, May 4, 1742, A Collection of Letters, on Sacred Subjects (Sheffield: Ward, 1761), 113–15; as transcribed on wesley-works.org/john-wesleys-in-correspondence.

For Transcriptions of Manuscript Texts:

Give a sufficient description of text. Indicate the holding institution of the original document and location details.

Examples:

Mehetabel Wesley to John Wesley, Mar. 7, 1725, MARC,¹ DDWF 9/1; as transcribed on wesley-works.org/john-wesleys-in-correspondence.
Howell Harris to John Wesley, Oct. 24, 1741, National Library of Wales, Trevecka Letters, #399; as transcribed on wesley-works.org/john-wesleys-in-correspondence.
